<sup>45</sup> Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, <sup>46</sup> and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, <sup>47</sup> and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem.

# A Message from Your Lay Leader Do you give God the first fruits of your day? By Warren Wright



Back in 2010 we had a Sunday afternoon Bible Study "Christianity's Family Tree" by Adam Hamilton. We studied what other Christian religions believed and why. One of the common themes that we read about throughout all of these religions is the "Power of Prayer". So this month I want to focus on what prayer should mean to us, and particularly Morning Prayer.

The morning is an excellent time for devotions. If you schedule to do it during your day or in the evening, what happens when your day or evening become so hectic that your devotion time gets pushed out of the line up?

By having communion with God the Father in the morning, we are saying, "God, you are most important in my priorities and I will give you the first fruit of my day." If we allow time for God first thing in the morning, He will bring together the rest of your day. You will be full spiritually and will not be hungry for this world. If you wait until later to have devotions with your Father, it most likely gets pushed out of the line-up and never gets done, sometimes going days without talking with God or reading His Word. You will fill yourself up with the world and be too stuffed to eat spiritually when you get home.

Jesus followed the Word of God in giving the Father first place in His thoughts, prayers and activities. David writes, "Let me hear your loving kindness in the morning for I trust in You. Make me to know the way in which I should walk for to You I lift my soul" (Psalm 143:8-11). By having our devotion time in the morning, we can ask God to lead us in the direction in which we should go for the day. Ask for God's provision, guidance, and protection. I would recommend that you spend at least 15 minutes in devotion with God every morning, if not more.

Mark 1:35-In the morning, while it was still very dark, he got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed.



# MAY POP! (POWER OF PRAYER!)


