Pastor Ken's Corner

Ephesians 6:10-20 (NRSV)

¹⁰ Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his power.

¹¹ Put on the whole armor of God, so that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil.

¹² For our struggle is not against enemies of blood and flesh, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers of this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. ¹³ Therefore take up the whole armor of God, so that you may be able to withstand on that evil day, and having done everything, to stand firm. ¹⁴ Stand therefore, and fasten the belt of truth around your waist, and put on the breastplate of righteousness. ¹⁵ As shoes for your feet put on whatever will make you ready to proclaim the gospel of peace. ¹⁶ With all of these, take the shield of faith, with which you will be able to quench all the flaming arrows of the evil one. ¹⁷ Take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. ¹⁸ Pray in the Spirit at all times in every prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert and always persevere in supplication for all the saints. ¹⁹ Pray also for me, so that when I speak, a message may be given to me to make known with boldness the mystery of the gospel, ²⁰ for which I am an ambassador in chains. Pray that I may declare it boldly, as I must speak.

When days get too long and there seems to always be more things to do than there is daylight to do them in, and when it seems that the world just wants to argue and complain, and people can't seem to agree about much of anything, we **NEED** the **whole armor** of God to aid us in the struggle that just getting through another day sometimes becomes. When you read about each piece of armor, understanding how people prepared themselves for the battles that were commonplace for them, you can see how God provides us with equipment for the struggle. However, most of the protection is worn on the front of the body...meaning, in order to be provided the greatest amount of protection, we **MUST** face forward and **stand firm** to encounter the challenge and threat, firmly rooted on a strong foundation.

The **belt of truth**, the **breastplate of righteousness**, shoes to prepare us to proclaim the gospel, the shield **of faith** and the helmet **of salvation..**.each piece of equipment is a metaphor for how Jesus is with us and provides us all the gifts and talents we need to face every day and each encounter with faith and strength from our Creator.

And then there is the most powerful tool/instrument we have in our arsenal, PRAYER. You Prayer Warriors of Clarksbury are well prepared and experienced in prayer.

¹⁸ Pray in the Spirit at all times in every prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert and always persevere in supplication for all the saints.

Paul tells us to **Pray in the Spirit** at **ALL** times, and in every prayer and supplication, to stay alert and to persevere for all the saints. This is a very tough set of directions to follow consistently, day in and day out. But, Jesus is there with us and the Holy Spirt is there to strengthen us and to show us how to keep on struggling with whatever challenge we have. And one other note, sometimes as we stand firm, we need to have faith that the Lord has our back and that sometimes we need to **LET** God handle those challenges that are too tough.

This passage is a powerful list of equipment that we need to consciously take up each day with our daily devotions, and then practice throughout the day in all our interactions in the world.

We must remain alert and keep on persevering as we pray for ALL of God's children.

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR LAY LEADER By Warren Wright

In the next few months your elected Church Council and Finance Committee will be meeting to discuss and prepare a budget for 2019.



Like any other entity, your church needs capital to operate and that money comes directly from you the members and other affiliated persons of Clarksbury. In the coming months, I want us to begin a prayerful process as we individually decide what we will give to the ministry of our church. In the scriptures, God has a plan for us and it's not what we hear on the economic news each day. You hear about the stock market and its ups and downs, the rising and falling prices of oil and the problems faced by the banks and S&L institutions. You're well aware of the world's economic plan or the lack of it. But I want to tell you about God's economic plan. In 1 Timothy 6:17-19, is a passage that may explain God's economic plan better than any other.

"Command those who are rich in this present world not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, which is so uncertain, but to put their hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment.

"Command them to do good, to be rich in good deeds, and to be generous and willing to share. In this way they will lay up treasure for themselves as a firm foundation for the coming age, so that they may take hold of the life that is truly life."

One of the greatest mistakes, I think, that we make when we talk about money in the church is that we often do it in the context of a special appeal or in a crisis situation.

If we are told that there are thousands of starving people who need our help and a special offering is taken, if that strikes your fancy, you'll probably give and maybe even give sacrificially to help meet that need. Or if you are reminded that the church needs your gift for the building fund, and you feel that that's a legitimate need, then you will give generously in response to that need, too.

And the result is that too often Christian people have been conditioned to think that the only time they really need to get serious about giving is when there is a need that appeals to their particular emotion. And some needs are just more appealing than others, aren't they?

But the problem actually starts with us, with people who don't recognize that the **teaching of Scripture is not to give to needs but to give to the glory of God.** We are stewards of God's wealth. God provides it to us, and He says, "Here you are, you are all stewards." We don't have a choice in that. Our God is a giving God. He has given all to us, and He wants His people to learn how to be generous, too, and willing to share.

We are like the people in the parable of the talents. God gives us something to use for a while, and then finally He comes back, like the master in the parable, and He says, "Now give me an accounting. What have you done with what I have given you to use during your time on the face of the earth?" The Day of Judgment will be the day of accounting.

On the first day of every week, each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with his income.—I Corinthians 16:2 NIV



AUGUST POP! (POWER OF PRAYER!)S

A.C.T.S. is an easy way to remember key elements of prayer. It's simply prayer in four parts:

Adoration – "Praise be to God!" - Psalms 68:35

Tell God how much you appreciate Him. Express your love for Him. Praise His power and majesty. This is a great way to begin your prayer time. Sometimes I watch the sun rise, and praise God for the beauty of His creation. You should never run out of praise. "How awesome are your deeds!" -Psalms 66:3

Confession – "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just, and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." - 1 John 1:9

Tell Him where you have fallen short. Be specific. I thank Him for the forgiveness I have in Christ, and ask for help and strength to turn away from future temptations.

Thanksgiving – Always "glorify him with thanksgiving." - Psalms 69:30

You have plenty of reasons to be thankful. Thank God for His love, His faithfulness, His patience and a million other things. Express gratitude for what He's doing in your life. Thank Jesus for dying on the cross for you. Thank the Holy Spirit for indwelling you, and never leaving. Thank Him for being your conscience, your counselor and that "still small voice."

Supplication – "Make your requests known to God." - Philippians 4:6

Tell God what you want, no matter how small it seems to you. Do you really think any of your requests are big to God the Creator? You should have lots of intercessory prayer here. Remember: As a Promise Keeper, you are committed to pray for your pastor and your church every day.
