Ephesians 3:5-12 (NRSV)

JANUARY POP! (POWER OF PRAYER!)

From a May 2012 <u>International Lesion</u> Adult Bible Study, by Randy Cross:



At a live Nativity scene at a church I served a number of years ago, the congregation arranged to have two sheep brought in and put in a pen for the three hours the live Nativity was displayed. I was there when the shepherd arrived with his sheep. The shepherd was not dressed a robe. He was wearing blue jeans, a brown jacket and gloves. Yet it was how he acted that shook my understanding of shepherds. He opened the gate of the trailer, reached in, and with one hand grabbed a sheep by the scruff of the neck and grasped its little tail with the other. This shepherd hoisted, shoved, and dropped the sheep into the pen before the sheep could even turn around; and then just as quickly, he put the other one in as well! I respected that kind of authority and expertise. The shepherd did not coax or try to convince the sheep that it might be in their best interests to walk over to the pen and find their resting place. Nor did he gently turn them around and apologize for making them go where they might not have wanted to go. He took charge and the sheep knew he was in charge. They knew their master.

For a moment, I imagined Jesus "handling" me as one of His sheep. Would he grab me by the scruff of the neck and drop me in a pen if that was necessary? Curiously, I did not think He would; but then again, we usually do no deal with straight-forward-act-with purpose shepherding of Jesus. . . until we get to the cleansing of the Temple. Yet maybe we should keep this image in mind more often. Maybe it would be good for us to imagine that sometimes our whining and our deal-making with God are not to be tolerated. Maybe there are times when we just need to expect a strong hand to grab us and put us where we should be, no questions asked. If we are in relationship with the "Shepherd," maybe our ideas need to reflect more of what the Shepherd wants instead of what we might want. It is an image worth pursuing . . .!
