Jesus answered, "I have told you, and you do not believe. The works that I do in my Father's name testify to me; <sup>26</sup> but you do not believe, because you do not belong to my sheep. <sup>27</sup> My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me.

<sup>28</sup> I give them eternal life, and they will never perish. No one will snatch them out of my hand. <sup>29</sup> What my Father has given me is greater than all else, and no one can snatch it out of the Father's hand.

<sup>30</sup> The Father and I are one."

The people who had heard about this miracle worker, this teacher, this man who was drawing crowds of people to himself everywhere he went, want to know is He the promised **Messiah**, the one foretold in prophetic works.

They wanted Jesus to announce himself in terms that they wanted to see and could understand.

They wanted Jesus to declare himself a RULER like DAVID or SOLOMON. The great challenge then and now is who <u>they believed then</u> and who <u>we believe now</u> the SAVIOR of the world IS, and WHAT the Messiah has come to do.

On the face of Jesus' comments, we see the dilemma the people have. They want something clearly demonstrated...like hosts of angels casting out the Roman rulers and establishing an earthly dominion. Jesus tells them only that the miracles and other "*works that I do*" testify and announce plainly that Jesus is here to do the Father's work.

He further states that those who belong to him hear His voice and will follow. They receive the gift of eternal life; no one can snatch them from Jesus. God the Father has given Jesus something stronger than anything else, and Jesus and the Father are ONE.

As we move into the rest of the Christian year, we should meditate on what the seasons of Lent and Easter teach us. God is great, His LOVE is great, and we can have FAITH in <u>WHO</u> JESUS IS.

<u>God has already done all that needs to be done</u> for our **RECONCILIATION to GOD.** We can then step out with confidence on the path that Christ lays out for us...the WAY, the TRUTH and the LIFE...His WAY!!!



Maybe you'll soon be getting married. Or <u>starting a new job.</u> Or <u>launching a business</u>. Or moving somewhere new or speaking publicly about something you're passionate about. Or in some other way boldly going where you've never gone before.

At such times, prayer can be your *firma terra*, your force field, and your fuel. If you're about to take brave new steps of any kind, try adopting—or adapting—some of the following prayers: 1) "Lord, as you were with Abram when you called him out of Ur, so be with me in this new venture. You are my shield, my very great reward, and I know that nothing is too hard for You." (Based on Genesis 15:1, 18:14)

**2)** "May the God before whom Abraham and Isaac walked, the God who has been my Shepherd all of my life to this day, bless these steps I now take." (Based on Genesis 48:15-16)

**3)** "God, make me strong and courageous in this new undertaking. Let me not be afraid or discouraged, knowing that as You were with Joshua so you will be with me wherever I go." (Based on Joshua 1:9)

**4)** "In what I am about to do, may I be like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season, whose leaf does not wither, and who prospers in whatever they do." (Based on Psalm 1:3)

**5)** "Lord, Your word says that You direct the steps of the godly and delight in every detail of their lives. Let it be so with me as I take the next steps on this path." (Based on Psalm 37:23, NLT)

**6)** "May the favor of the Lord our God rest on us; establish the work of our hands for us—yes, establish the work of our hands." (Psalm 90:17, NIV)

**7)** "I trust in you, Lord, with all my heart. Help me not to lean on my own understanding but to acknowledge You in everything. Make my path straight. Help me not to be wise in my own eyes but to hear Your voice telling me, 'This is the way; walk in it.'" (Based on Proverbs 3:5-7 and Isaiah 30:21)

#### What is LIFT Children of Middlesex?

A community outreach ministry with a focus on reaching children that do not know Jesus. We want to create opportunities to be with children in our community allowing us to share the love of Jesus. We are planting seeds for God to harvest.

#### When did this ministry begin?

In April of 2018 Zoar and Harmony Grove joined together to share concerns that many of the children in the Middlesex schools did not know about Jesus and did not know the true meaning of Christmas or Easter. Since that time, Christians and church leaders from several churches in Middlesex have joined together in a variety of ways to connect with children and their families.

### What events has LIFT participated in this past year?

- In Summer of 2018, we printed and distributed flyers with a list of all vacation bible school programs in Middlesex County.
- In September we hosted an outdoor family movie night at the elementary school with a good turn-out of families.
- We were invited to participate with other community organizations at the elementary school for parent/teacher night. We talked with the families about churches in the community.
- We were invited to participated in "Trunk or Treat" at MES by handing out candy and we included handouts from participating churches.
- Handed out books about Christ's birth at the Urbanna Parade to children along the parade route.

### What are our future opportunities?

- Presently, we are planning an Easter Egg Hunt at the elementary school. There will be three stations: crafts, Resurrection Eggs, and the "hunt". The children will be grouped by age. This will take place on Saturday, April 13 from 1:00-3:00 PM with a rain date of April 14 from 2:00-4:00 PM. We invite you to join us.
- We are in the process of compiling a list of children's activities from each participating church. This list will be distributed to each child that comes to the egg hunt. It will be included with an Easter book about Christ in a matching bag.
- We are working closely with Middlesex Elementary School and they have agreed to give out flyers to children about the Egg Hunt, put it on their website and Facebook page and announce it on the intercom. In addition, we will advertise in the Southside Sentinel, church congregations, signage and through social media.
- We have been invited to meet with the principal at MES near the end of the school year to discuss future projects.

We meet on the third Monday of each month and it is our intention to rotate meeting locations so we all have an opportunity to host. Please join us for our next meeting. It will take place in the Fellowship Hall of Clarksbury Methodist Church in Deltaville, Monday, March 18 at 5:30PM – 6:30PM. Please bring information about your church activities for children and families to include on the handout.
