

#### Pastor Ken's Corner

Luke 10:38-42 (NRSV)

<sup>38</sup> Now as they went on their way, he entered a certain village, where a woman named Martha welcomed him into her home. <sup>39</sup> She had a sister named Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to what he was saying.

<sup>40</sup> But Martha was distracted by her many tasks; so she came to him and asked, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her then to help me." <sup>41</sup> But the Lord answered her, "Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; <sup>42</sup> there is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her."

We have an impressive list of events scheduled at Clarksbury for the month of July. June was busy, and July looks to be just as busy, if not more so, as people begin their vacations and our Vacation Bible School takes place.

We will have our **Monthly Mobile Food Pantry** on **Saturday**, **July** 7, with the Cryer Center (Clarksbury has lead). There is always plenty of work to go around for everyone.

Our community wide **VBS**, *Follow the Way*, is scheduled for **July 22-26**. We all need to look at our schedules to see if there is anything we can do to support this effort. More information on this from our Worship Committee will follow.

As we push forward into July, I pray our precious Lord richly blesses us and His ministries with His presence and power. As we serve our community God will show us the way of daily compassion and involvement.

We live in a world where, almost daily, we encounter opportunities to be **hospitable** to all of those we meet. In every instance we have not only an **<u>opportunity</u>**, but also an <u>**obligation**</u> to **SEE** the people around us and respond in a Christian and hospitable manner.

We welcome people in our community to receive food assistance with the Mobile Food Pantry; we invite and welcome children from our community to come to our VBS...just as Mary and Martha welcomed Jesus into their home.

Mary sits at Jesus' feet and listens to what He has to say. Martha, who is involved in doing the customary tasks of the household (possibly preparing a meal for their visitor), wants Mary to assist her and even asks Jesus to tell her to help her in the busy work of the household.

There seems to be nothing wrong with Martha's request and I think many would agree, given the same circumstances in our homes, we might make the same request.

Yet Jesus responds in a manner that must have surprised Martha. The scriptures do not give any more detail on this visit nor do they give us any information on how Martha may have reacted to this mild reproof /rebuke from Jesus.

I can imagine that Martha might have wondered why her busyness, which social norms would call for, is not the **better part**. How is it that Mary's attentiveness or listening to what Jesus is saying is the **BETTER part**?

I think the lesson we can draw from these short passages is, as important as **doing** the right thing (like being hospitable) is, the **BETTER** part is listening to and reading the Word of God.

So for this coming month and for the rest of the year let us be mindful that while we continue to DO good works and practice hospitality we are constantly mindful of what the Lord is telling us each and every day through our daily readings and meditations.

We came through Lent this spring focused on meditating and reading, sharing and worshipping, and celebrating and enjoying the Easter SONrise and the glory of Jesus. Now we need to be reminded that we are to always <u>and in ALL WAYS</u> be at the Master's feet listening to what He tells us and DOING what he commands us to DO.

As always, I will make every effort keep the Prayer Warrior e-mails updated with more information and updates as the available information changes. That in large part is possible only if, as circumstances change, someone lets me know. If you have an e-mail address and would like to receive the Prayer Warrior updates, please let me know and provide me with that address.

Please remember to be faithful in letting me know if you hear about one of "ours" who is headed to the hospital or is having an issue and is at the hospital or has been to the ER. I would prefer to hear twice about those in need rather than it be assumed that I must already know.



If we all participate, our home bound members will get a card frequently from church members, and will have more great memories of Clarksbury.


