After Jesus healed the 10 lepers as they had called on Jesus to have mercy upon them and they were all healed, <u>only one</u> turned back praising God and giving thanks for the miracle of healing. Being a leper in that day was a terrible condition, no one wanted to encounter you, no one wanted to help you because there were few treatments to cure or heal this affliction. It could be a lonely and greatly diminished life. Interestingly, the one who came back was a foreigner, a Samaritan, who knew how great a miracle Jesus has given him and he gave thanks to God and Jesus tells him to go on his way as his **FAITH** had made him well.

As we serve those in our community through our food ministries: Food Pantry; Soup Ministry; and the Cryer Mobile food Pantry we are, through our Faith and actions, serving others in need. We give thanks for each opportunity we have to serve Our Lord and our community. When we do these acts of Mercy and through our bible studies, prayer Warrior prayers and other Acts of Piety we are actively doing the work of Disciples of Jesus Christ.

Sometimes we have to stop and take stock in where we are and what we are doing and where that puts us on the path to being an Intentional Disciple of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the World.

To that end, The Ministry Excellence Team (MET) of the York River District and Our District Superintendent have invited all the churches in the District to take the *Real Discipleship Survey* to discover where we are on the journey of the spiritual maturity as disciples of Jesus Christ.

I believe the survey results would be very beneficial to individuals as well as congregations as a whole for their intentional discipleship journey. I will be available to walk you through the survey if you would like, though the link above provides instructions and details. I have already set up our Church portion with two groups, Leadership and Disciples, choose Leadership if you are currently serving on Committees or Church Council, choose Disciples for all others. If you have any questions see me or Warren Wright.

So, I'm interested in the results as we endeavor to see where we are currently, individually as well as collectively, on our Path to Discipleship, and determine where our strengths are and where we can improve on our walk with Our Savior Jesus the Christ!

Let us continue daily to DO "good works" and practice **extravagant hospitality** to all we meet and seek to find what the Lord is telling us each and every day through our daily readings and constant meditations.

Prayer Warrior e-mails and updates will be sent out as circumstances warrant and are made known to me. You are all such great Prayer Warriors and I applaud you for your Faithfulness and compassion for those in need. If you have an e-mail address and would like to receive the Prayer Warrior updates, please let me know and provide your e-mail address.

Please remember to be faithful in letting me know if you hear about one of "ours" who is headed to the hospital or is having an issue and is at the hospital or has been to the ER. I would prefer to hear twice about those in need rather than it be assumed that I must already know.

"Disciples Called to Action: Creating Unity in Ministry" Laity Sunday October 20th A Message from Your Lay Leader Warren Wright

According to Section 264:2 of the "Book Of Discipline" of the United Methodist Church the third Sunday in October of each year shall be designated "Laity Sunday." The discipline tells us that Laity Sunday calls the Church to celebrate the ministry of all lay Christians, as their lives are empowered for the ministry by the Holy Spirit. The observance of Laity Sunday shall be under the the general supervision of the General Board of Discipline. The Association of Annual Conference Lay Leaders will recommend themes for an entire quadrennium to the General Board of Discipline two years before the beginning of a new quadrennium. As your lay Leader it is my responsibility to develop the entire service for Laity Sunday with assistance and guidance from Pastor Ken. As lay members of Clarksbury, many of you will be a part of this service. The founder of Methodism, John Wesley, realized early in his ministry that he would need a lot of help spreading the word of God. So he appointed folks, just like you and I, to take the word of God to the people.



How to Pray for People You Disagree With by Bob Hostetler Jesus offers specific instructions on how to pray for those who make us angry We live in disturbing times. Sometimes it seems as if division and discord surround us, affecting our nation, our cities, even our churches. Even our minds and hearts. It's hard to know how to respond. We can try to shout it down. We can try to shut it out.

We can respond with prayer, of course, and often we do. We can pray against chaos. We can pray against those who spread it. But notice what Jesus told His followers:

"Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your Father in heaven. He causes His sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous. If you love those who love you, what reward will you get? Are not even the tax collectors doing that? And if you greet only your own people, what are you doing more than others? Do not even pagans do that? Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Matthew 5:44-48, NIV).

Jesus said to pray *for* our enemies. For some of us, that might be a neighbor or colleague who always seems to criticize or undercut us. For others, it might be a public figure we don't agree with.

God didn't say to pray for them to be silenced; He said to pray for <u>God's blessings</u> on them. He said that we should be like our Father in heaven, who sends the blessings of sunshine and the blessings of rain on everyone, even the evil and the unrighteous. He said that, when we lovingly pray for those who persecute us, we act like children of our perfectly loving God.

In times like this, we might wish Jesus hadn't said such things. But strange things begin to happen when we pray for those we think of as enemies. We might see a change in them, sure. But if we truly pray *for* them—for blessings to shine and rain down on them—we will see sooner and deeper changes happening in us. It's hard to stay offended when we pray for the offender's deepest wounds. It's hard to respond unkindly when we're sincerely praying for God's kindness to be showered on others. It's hard to repay hate with hate when we are trying to "love [our] enemies and pray for those who persecute [us]."

Whether God answers your prayers by changing the hearts of others—or only yours your prayers will be answered.Try it. Pray lovingly for those who offend and persecute others. And watch what God does.
