We have learned a couple of new tricks on how to present our worship services and have gone through a few growth pains on learning how best to record and then distribute the services.

I want to share a couple of goals for the coming year with you. I think we managed to continue to stay connected and involved with our community; it was challenging at times but you persevered. Our Goal Number One is to maintain our connection with our community regardless of how difficult it might become with COVID restrictions.

We have found a number of ways to innovate and use new technologies to worship, and you keep finding new ways to stay involved, from music at the Maritime Museum outdoors to music at the Rescue Squad when it got colder. We have had small groups meet on patios and around fire pits at other homes. Goal Number Two is to continue be flexible and innovative when it comes to finding ways, locations, methods and opportunities to be worshipful and to remain connected as we progress out of the COVID restrictions, and yet maintain safety.

This congregation has been so resilient throughout the pandemic and we have still worshipped together and we have continued to lift our voices in praise together and served our community together. Terry and I are happy to be part of YOUR ministries at Clarksbury.

We will have our Cryer Center Mobile Food Pantry on Saturday, November 6, from 9 to 11 a.m. We always have room for more help.

COVID restrictions and protocols are relaxed but many still remain, and we must keep in mind that the threat is not eliminated, and in some cases is elevated again. For some, the risks of COVID are very real and very present. We continue to lift up in our prayers those who are at risk and still under many restrictions.

We will soon be starting our Advent Bible Study "Light of the World" by Amy-Jill Levine. We will dig deep into the history of the birth of Christ.

In Light of the World: A Beginner's Guide to Advent, author, professor, and biblical scholar Amy-Jill Levine explores the biblical texts surrounding the story of the birth of Jesus. Join her as she traces the Christmas narrative through the stories of Zechariah and Elizabeth, Mary, the journey to Bethlehem, and the visit from the Magi. These stories open conversations around connections of the Gospel stories to the Old Testament, the role of women in first-century Jewish culture, the importance of Mary's visitation and the revolutionary implications of Mary's Magnificat, the census and the stable, and the star of Bethlehem and the flight to Egypt.

Our first of four sessions will be on Wednesday, November 17, at 2 p.m. in the social hall. The cost of the book is \$10. I've ordered 10 books for now; let me know in advance if you plan to attend to I'll have time to order more books if needed. Warren and I will be rotating teaching sessions and I'm looking forward to it.

We continue to acknowledge the generosity and efforts of our **Soup**Ministry Prayer Warriors Prayer Partners each month. They provide meals, soup, gifts, cards, letters and phone calls to many of our members as well as those at Fishing Bay Estates and other locations.

Keep the small groups and gatherings in your prayers as we look to new ways to restart these meaningful and joyful worship and sharing opportunities.

## A Note from your Lay Leader 5 Kernels of Corn Warren Wright

The Pilgrim Fathers who landed at Plymouth Rock over 300 years ago knew nothing of the affluent times which you and I enjoy today in this great country of ours. The next time you and I are tempted to complain about inflation and the state of our economy, remember the following: During that first long winter at Plymouth Colony, seven times as many graves were made for the dead as homes for the living. The ship which was to bring food and relief brought 35 more mouths to feed, but not an ounce of provisions. Touching indeed is the picture of William Brewster, rising from a scanty Plymouth dinner, consisting of a plate of clams and a glass of cold water, to thank God "for the abundance of the sea and the treasures hid in the sand." The Pilgrims didn't have much, but they possessed a great gratitude and it was upon this very thing that America was built. These stalwart people, strong, devout and sincere were the timbers upon which our nation was founded. They had a custom of putting 5 kernels of corn upon each empty plate before a dinner of "thanksgiving" was served. Each member of the family would pick up a kernel and tell what they were thankful for. It was to remind them that the first Pilgrims were in such dire straits that their allowance was only 5 kernels of corn per person each day. We have many reasons to be thankful. Let's take 5 grains of corn, and think of 5 things to praise God for. In Psalm 103, David calls upon his body, mind, soul, and spirit to join in one grand symphony of praise for the benefits God has so graciously bestowed upon him. Can you see the 5?




#### Nurture and Outreach Jerry Dant
