I think that often, in this season I find myself viewing the weeks leading up to Christmas and New Years like a Christmas buffet that has more great dishes to taste and sample than I could ever consume without bursting.

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The Prophet Isaiah focuses us on the Attitude of Gratitude we should strive to attain in this season. Rather than the material things, this Christmas and Advent, I urge us all to celebrate and focus on what the Lord is doing in our lives. Give thanks to the Lord and call upon his name! Focus on the Joy and share the Good News of Salvation given through the BABY JESUS born long ago and far away in a little town of Bethlehem to fulfill the promise of our Redemption made long ago.

It has been a very interesting year and Clarksbury has maintained many of our ministries, though somewhat modified because of Covid. I pray we can continue these ministries even in light of the new variant of OMICRON COVID. Our PRG/HCT will review and adjust based upon our LOCAL environment and guidance from the Conference and Health Officials.

I want to **restate the goals** for the coming year that I shared last month with you.

We managed to stay connected and involved in our community, it was challenging at times, but you persevered. **Goal number One** is to maintain our connection with our community regardless of how difficult it might become with COVID restrictions.

We have found a number of ways to innovate and use new technologies to worship and you keep finding new ways to stay involved, from music at the Maritime Museum outdoors to Music at the rescue Squad when it got colder. We have had small groups meet at back patios and around fire pits at other homes.

Goal Number Two is to continue be flexible and innovative when it comes to finding ways, locations, methods, and opportunities to be worshipful and to remain connected as we progress with all the COVID restrictions, and yet maintain safety.

You guys have been so resilient throughout the pandemic, and we have still worshipped together, we have continued to lift our voices in Praise together and served our community together. Terry and I are happy to be part of YOUR ministries at Clarksbury. We have our Cryer Center Mobile Food Pantry on Saturday the December 4<sup>th</sup> from 9 AM - 11 AM. We always have room for more help.

COVID restrictions and protocols are relaxed but many still remain, and we must keep in mind that the threat is not eliminated, **and in some cases is elevated again with the recent variant....OMICRON**. For some, the risks of COVID are very real and very present. We continue to lift up in our prayers those who are at risk and still under many restrictions.

Our Post-COVID Re-Entry Group (PRG)came up with a plan and we submitted that Mitigation Assistance Plan to our District Superintendent who saw no needs to revise the plan. We will continue to monitor the local situation and as necessary make adjustments.


We continue our Advent Bible Study *"Light of the World"* by Amy-Jill Levine. We will dive deep into the history of the birth of Christ. In Light of the World: A Beginner's Guide to Advent, author, professor, and biblical scholar Amy-Jill Levine explores the biblical texts surrounding the story of the birth of Jesus. Join her as she traces the Christmas narrative through the stories of Zechariah and Elizabeth, Mary, the journey to Bethlehem, and the visit from the Magi. These stories open conversations around connections of the Gospel stories to the Old Testament, the role of women in first-century Jewish culture, the importance of Mary's visitation and the revolutionary implications of Mary's Magnificat, the census and the stable, and the star of Bethlehem and the flight to Egypt.

With our third session Tuesday Dec 7<sup>th</sup> at 2 PM and the fourth(final) session on Tuesday December 14 at 2 PM in the Social Hall. Warren and I will be rotating teaching sessions and I'm looking forward to it.

We continue to acknowledge the generosity and efforts of our **Soup Ministry/Prayer Warriors/Prayer Partners** each month. They provide meals, soup, gifts, cards, letters, and phone calls to many of our members as well as those at Fishing Bay Estates and other locations.

Keep the small groups and gatherings in your prayers as we look to new ways to restart these meaningful and joyful worship and sharing opportunities.

Merry Christmas fellow Christians! This is a season we celebrate and are joyous, but we should also count our

blessings and be generous with the gifts the Lord has given us. This recent reading [abbreviated] hit home for me:

That nice, warm feeling you're carrying over from Thanksgiving? That fullness after the big family get-together? From the meal, from the company, from having plenty of it all? It's important that you realize not everyone is feeling that right now.

In fact, many people are experiencing the exact opposite. More than <u>950 million people</u> globally are food insecure. More than <u>38 million people</u> in America still face hunger. And some <u>1.5 million children</u> lost their primary or secondary caregiver from COVID-19 and now, those children don't know where their next meal is coming from. You might be thinking: So what? What can I do about it?

Focus on what's in your control. Those suffering humans are us, and we are them. To allow harm to come to them—through indifference or through callousness—is to allow harm to come to ourselves. Hierocles was a Roman Stoic who spoke of "circles of concern." Our first concern, he said, was our mind, but beyond this was our concern for our bodies, for our immediate family, then our extended family. Like concentric rings, these circles were followed by our concern for our community, our city, our country, our empire, our world. The work of philosophy, he said, was to draw this outer concern inward, to learn how to care as much as possible for as many people as possible, to do as much good for them as possible. [Sounds a lot like John Wesley].

This is our obligation. It is our duty to help others and to serve others. This will illustrate those virtues of courage and justice toward and for and through others. We can make a difference, and indeed we must in the short time we are given. This is as Christmas as it gets.


#### Mail a card of happiness to our home bound members!


